How to connect my fintie keyboard to my ipad

November 13, 2020November 21, 2020 Tablets have never really had a major share of the computer market. Unless it is an iPad, a tablet is a secondary or even tertiary device for most people. It does seem that the market has demanded that tablets move away from being just tablets and becoming more geared towards traditional computer tasks. This causes issues since tablets are not really designed with workflow in mind. Enter the Bluetooth keyboard. I recently acquired one for my personal tablet. Here is a review of the Fintie Bluetooth Keyboard: Pricing \$27.99 on Amazon (11-13-2020) \$32.99 on Walmart.com (11-13-2020) Unboxing and Initial Thoughts My tablet is a 2018 Samsung Galaxy A 8.0 inch model so I ordered the corresponding Fintie Folio Keyboard Case and Keyboard. The packaging was straightforward and came with a Micro USB to USB type-A cable. Yes, it is a micro power connector for the keyboard which is sad in this world of type-C connectors. It was a bit disappointing but not unexpected at this price point (\$27.99). The construction of the Fintie Keyboard is exceptional with little to no flex when applying pressure. I do like the feeling of the ABS materials as well. They make it feel premium without the premium price tag. The keyboard itself is magnetic which is a nice feature when combined with the included magnetic folio. The magnets are strong and the keyboard does not move when typing. Fintie Bluetooth Keyboard and Keyboard Case (Folio) User Experience Connecting the keyboard to my tablet was painless. The connect button and on/off switch have a nice, sturdy feel to them and the light on the connect button is nice and clear. The same is true for the caps lock, connection, charge, and power lights. I found that the typing experience takes a little time to familiarize myself with. The smaller form factor of the Fintie keyboard means that some of the keys had to be put in a non-standard position such as the question mark and apostrophe keys. If you have larger hands, you might want to steer clear as the smaller form factor forces the hands into a cramped position. Overall, the standard American Qwerty layout was followed so touch typers should be able to adjust. I am actually typing this review on my tablet using the Fintie keyboard and after 30 mins or so, I found that I am typing around 45 wpm which is a bit slower than my usual but still surprising on a tablet keyboard. The actuation of the keys themselves is nice with a satisfying sound with each press. Battery life was never a problem as the Amazon store page claims that the keyboard can go three years before needing a recharge. An issue I have with the keyboard is the fn key. The position of the key is on the bottom row and all the way to the left. I never really got used to this position as it is different than the traditional one. Going with that, the functions themselves don't really have any use or productivity benefits. The functions include cut, copy, paste, find, etc. but their position is less convenient than the normal "ctrl+x", "ctrl+c", and so on. Other Uses To complete the testing of the Fintie keyboard, I connected to other devices such as my OnePlus 5t and my media center PC. It worked as expected but without the magnetic holder of the folio, the keyboard tended to slide around a lot on smooth surfaces. I also found that using it in my lap was a bit bothersome due to the form-factor. It is somewhere between a full size wireless keyboard and a mini hand held and multiple times I found I wanted one of the other sizes when using the Fintie with my media center. It works in a pinch but it is certainly not ideal. Fintie Keyboard on Magnetic Keyboard Case Final Thoughts Overall, I found the Fintie Keyboard and Folio to be a nice accessory to my tablet. It definitely turned a device that I mostly used as a reader into a decent machine for content creation. I actually started to enjoy using my tablet for writing which I was not expecting. With it's three year battery life and quality construction, I hope to be using this keyboard for a long time. I give the Fintie Keyboard a B+ final grade. Speaking to its general layout, one writes, "The keyboard is perfectly sized. I can type with ease, and don't have to hunt and peck due to weird key placement." Another writes, "The keyboard's backlighting helps see the keys easily," and, along with a few other reviewers, points out that the light "will shut off after about 5 seconds of non-activity, so it doesn't really drain the battery." If, however, you're particularly concerned about conserving the battery, many mention that the backlight can be easily turned off, and you can also choose between two brightness settings. SPARIN Bluetooth Keyboard "I needed a cost-effective solution when the Smart Keyboard for my iPad stopped connecting after about two years of use," writes one reviewer, and they couldn't be happier they went with this one. "This is a great little keyboard that's definitely made for Apple products — the function bar across the top has functionality for screenshots, iTunes, brightness, and sleep mode. Also, the command keys on the bottom of the keyboard are laid out like an Apple laptop (making my life way easier!)." Others also rave that this pairs seamlessly with their Apple products, and essentially turns their iPad into a laptop. "The keyboard is a nearly full-size QWERTY device, and I am easily able to use my typing skills, allowing my fingers to keep up with my brain," one writes, while another says: "Just because of this paired with my iPad, I have saved over \$1,000 because I didn't have to go buy a computer." More than 10 percent of reviewers also mention the exceptional battery life on this wireless keyboard. One even says, "I still haven't changed the batteries from when I bought it months ago, and I use it all the time as I'm a full-time student." Omoton Ultra-Slim Bluetooth Keyboard According to one enthusiastic reviewer, the Omoton is the "best thing since buttered bread!" Another says, "basically this Keyboard is a dream. Lightweight, easy to travel with, and the keys feel great when typing. This keyboard looks beautiful and looks very similar to Apple's wireless keyboard yet it's 90% cheaper!!!" According to another satisfied customer, "Its simple to use. I enjoy it. Cheap as hell and deserves 7 stars. Functionality is great too!" Nulaxy Rechargeable Bluetooth Keyboard Reviewers with iPads of all sizes rave about this keyboard, which connects to any smart device via Bluetooth. In fact, over 150 other five-star reviewers describe the Bluetooth pairing as "easy," including one customer who "despises" checking their email on their iPhone or iPad and can now "quickly respond to emails and keep on with my day without missing a beat. Pairing to my devices took less than 30 seconds." Another initially skeptical reviewer says, "The keyboard synced with my iPad on the first try with the included instructions so setup couldn't have been easier," and they now happily use it to journal on their iPad mini. This keyboard's long battery life (advertised as up to 60 days of charge) and magnetic cover-slash-stand also get praise. "I've had this keyboard for nearly a year, and have only charged it three times," begins one reviewer, who says they use it almost daily in academic classes. "The stand works great for school, either on a desk or in my lap," they add. Another reviewer, who's used this keyboard with their tablet (in lieu of a computer) for over a year, says it's proven to be "extremely durable," adding that the case both "looks good and protects the keyboard when folded" and acts as a functional stand when open. More than 90 reviewers say they've used the Yekbee keyboard to basically turn their iPad into a laptop. "The strongest feature is the multi-angle support. You can use as a laptop, tent-fold, and tablet." Another reviewer says the case fit their iPad like a glove. Plus, they say, "the lighted keys are AWESOME and can either choose a steady color or have it rotate through the colors. I'm using it to type this review, and I'm an avid and fast typist and the keys feel great." Other reviews mention how great the 360-degree swivel works, allowing you to lay the case and iPad flat if you don't need to use the keyboard. iClever Bluetooth Keyboard "This little keyboard rocks! I use it in conjunction with my iPad, instead of lugging my laptop everywhere, and since it tri-folds, this easily fits in a small backpack or tote bag/purse. Or if your a minimalist, in a cargo pocket," one reviewer explains. Other purchasers agree that it's compact and easy to transport, with over 200 reviewers using the word "portable" in their comments. Another writes, to the same effect, "This keyboard is amazing. I've paired it once to my iPad and every time I've used it, I just open it up and start typing. No re-pairing, which I find to be a pain. Just unfold it and start typing. It folds up very small and is easy to travel with." Of 1,222 reviews, nearly 700 praise the Jelly Comb for its portability and foldable design. "Wow! The value in this thing is simply hard to match. It works with all three major operating systems and it takes seconds to pair," says one customer. Another says, "I've had this one for about 4 months now, and it works better than many other Bluetooth keyboards that I've tried in the past." People seem to especially like the folding mechanism, which has the added benefit of automatically turning the keyboard on or off when opened or closed. One reviewer describes it this way: "Fully opened, the keyboard is just shy of twice the length of my phone. The mild magnets inside help keep the unit closed, but it doesn't take too much force to open. There are no clasps or locks to keep the keyboard folded otherwise." "The white keys and silver body match the tablet, and the pull-out stand works well," says one reviewer. "It makes a functional combo and, when combined with a Bluetooth mouse, can be used like a small laptop computer." According to another reviewer, "The sliding stand works well to hold phones and tablets from four to 10.5 inches or so (as advertised), as long as you are using it on a table." They also mention that the stand seems delicate but should work just fine for most users. Other reviewers like the fact that the keyboard uses AAA batteries, so they don't have to spend time charging another device. "The keys are a nice size and not too small or compact. It even has an option to switch use between windows, android, or iOS," says another reviewer. A reviewer who bought a cheaper keyboard case for their iPad but ended up returning it for the Logitech couldn't believe the difference. "It literally took five seconds to setup and connect the keyboard with my iPad. The keys are much larger and easier to use," they say. "And there are Apple shortcut keys. It is less bulky than the first keyboard and, for my mind, offers better protection. And there are replaceable batteries. All in all a great product and purchase." Another person who also tried another brand (Apple) before buying this one was very happy with the switch: "It's flawless, although a little on the thick side. Both my wife and I would rather have a keyboard that works consistently, protects the iPad, and doesn't tip the iPad than be 'stylish' and use the thin Apple keyboard. Hats off to Logi for a stellar keyboard case." While most keyboard cases fit a range of nine- to ten-inch iPads, the most recent 12.9-inch model requires a bigger case, and this one from Chesona gets over 500 five-star reviews. "WHAT ARE YOU WAITING FOR? GET THIS!" begins one reviewer, who devotes over 1,000 words of praise to this keyboard case. "The keys depress easily, accurately, and there is no latency at all. I can type pretty fast, and I have yet to see a flaw in the key response or error in key selection," he says adding that the case "has a wonderful non-slip rubbery feel to the outside. This is awesome for carrying the case because it will not slip out of your hands." Another reviewer, who considered buying the Apple iPad keyboard case, says that this product is a "fraction of the price" and more protective. Plus, they add, "the keyboard stays in place magnetically and is very secure so you don't have to worry about it moving once it's in place or falling out of the case." In fact, dozens of other customers prefer this keyboard case to the Apple product, including one artist who appreciates the removable keyboard, for laying the iPad down to draw, and Apple pencil charging spot which enables them to "charge it without having to take my iPad out of the case." Logitech K380 Multi-Device Bluetooth Keyboard Reviewers say Logitech's "multi-device" Bluetooth keyboard works very well as an iPad keyboard, but they also celebrate its ability to easily pair with — and switch between — multiple devices, even if you're using different operating systems on each. "It's a perfect size for portability, and it's lightweight and easy to type on," writes one, adding, "However, where this keyboard shines is how you can switch between Bluetooth devices. It's so easy to pair and quick to switch. I currently use it for a Surface Pro and iPhone." Reviewers like that it's portable, and one customer says that since it works with multiple devices, it allowed them to save some space in their suitcase on a recent trip: "This keyboard makes typing on an iPhone or iPad mini extremely easy and efficient.
