It's not a huge help, but is a good way to start. Make sure to station the blue hero Gatekeeper: Batty. Her second skill increases hero experience earnings significantly. It will cost you durability and resources to be one of the quickest ways to increase your Hero's levels. Vehicles are the most expensive troop to use combating Zombies and cost a considerable amount of Fuel to heal them. I typically use Fighters and Shooters to kill Zombies. I have often moved the heroes from APC to APC in order to continue bashing zombies for experience. As one APC's durability is exhausted, I will move the heroes to another APC and use up its durability killing high level zombies. If you can, combine the CoZ Hero Development day with several Daily Hero Challenges, there is one Daily that gives you points for killing Zombies. 5. If you have a Development Hero that needs to be leveled up, you can also add them to an APC and use them for combat. Combat Hero Awaken increases your Might, Resistance, the High Leader numbers and sometimes your Hit Points (HP). The High Leader skill is what is of value to most people.
