Printing a FixedLength Label Normally, the length of the labe l is determined by the length of the text entered. However, you may wish to make a labe l for a specific purpose tha t is a fixed length rega rdless of the length of the text. Y ou can specify a fixed length for a l abel in 0.1" 2 mm increments b etween 1.5" 40 mm and 15.0" 400 mm. The preset fixed length is 4.0 " 100 mm. Any chang e you make to the fi xed length setting rem ains in effect until you c hange it.A twoline label is previewed as a singleline label. T o preview your label 1. Press. 2.
