This is a significant effort for a stereo pair, and practically impossible for a large console.

Differences are usually subtle but sometimes not. This issue has long been the bane of analog circuit designers. With digital models, we get exact channel matching for free. Isn't that great Brainworx says, no, not really, because channel to channel variance contributes to the huge sound of the old giant consoles of decades past. Using TMT, Brainworx supplies each of these plugins with 72 analog style variations, as would have happened with 72 real analog channels. The channels are numbered, and assignable to any instantiation of the plugin. These plugins are super efficient DSP wise, and I had no trouble loading 72 channels into my DAW, which is running on a 2012 Mac Mini. But there are also numerous optional enhancements that present themselves as tweaker

screws; and in the case of the added hysteresis control for the gate on the E and G plugins, the knob just appears when the feature is engaged. This level of devotion to the old days brings a tear to my eye. The Random buttons allow you to either randomly assign one of the 72 variants to the current instantiation, or assign random variants to all instantiations. You won't get any repeated variants until all 72 are spent, which means you can easily assemble more console combinations than you can count. The manual suggests you print a completed mix, randomize, and repeat — to achieve different flavors of the mix. They were close but did not cancel. I still feel the same way as before. I still liked and chose the TMT version though. Was I feeling sentimental for analogness Brainworx has added excellent sonic enhancements that were either not practical on the originals or not thought of. Why not extend that thinking to the layout. As it is, you have to learn these interfaces, and I was not able to do that without reading the manual. The manual is great, and full of interesting protips, so I didn't mind; but unless you already know these consoles, you will not hit the ground running with these plugins.

And why not have some value boxes that you can type into. I'd guess, based on the enthusiasm for the originals that is oozing through the manuals, that Brainworx wants this to feel as much like using the real consoles as possible. But given that I am staring at a glowing screen anyway, I'd like to take advantage of that screen. I am of course taking it for granted that these sound like the specific consoles they were modeled after. I have no way of knowing for sure, but on the other hand, I also don't care. They sound great, and all three versions are tied for the most feature-rich channel strips I have. So, in addition to analog enthusiasts everywhere, I'd also recommend these to folks just starting in recording. This sounds rad, but I think I accidentally closed the tab and forgot its name. They turn out to be more useful than you might imagine. The bx Control V2 features the mono maker which is very useful in its own right. The width control can be cranked right up, maybe extra wide compared to the Waves and TG but I'm personally unlikely to use it on max. Monitoring and panning options are fully featured in this plugin and once again will probably prove themselves to be more useful than one might first imagine. The TG is just a spreader but probably has a different sound to the bx and the Waves. The Waves is purely mid side level control, the bx and the TG width likely add some inverted phase stuff but my guess is they sound different. I'm still trying to figure out mixing so I have even touched on mastering yet. The digital V3 EQ does all kinds of neat stuff and is usable for both mixing for which they have a simplified GUI that's also less CPU usage and a full-blown GUI for mastering slightly more CPU usage but not that it matters much. It's not my first-call EQ for individual tracks I use HOFA IQEQ for that but when necessary I use it on my final 2bus. It's one of two EQs that I use for mastering but not at the same time. My other mastering EQ is the SPL PASEQ also available from PIA.

It's a passive EQ on steroids and takes a bit of getting used to like all passive EQs do. Once you get the hang of what they do you'll wonder how you got along without it. I'll use it to bring out a bit of oomph in the mid channel. One more EQ from the PIA stable and that is the Elysia Museq. For me it has limited use as I'm not too nuts on the sound of it. Other people seem to like it and I only have it because it came as part of an EQ bundle during a PIA sale. Yes I'm a fan of the Plugin Alliance world of plugins. So if I have two mono guitar tracks can I send them both to an Aux track and insert Center there. Also, when sending two mono tracks to say bus 12, if I send one to bus 1 and the other to bus 2, the pan knob disappears from the track. If I send each mono track to bus 12 the pan knob remains. Why does this happen. Does the mono track lose its pan setting when sent just to bus 1? And if so, does it get put back dead center, no matter how I had it originally panned? They turn out to be more useful than you might imagine. Hope that helps! Stephen Yep pretty much mostly what I think. Except the TG, I'm embarrassed to say I don't even know what that is!! Haha!! I do find the mono maker handy, and I do find the punch, hi and low controls just as handy. Ideally, you'd have both. Even more ideally someone will put all of these in the one plugin. However, I opt for better panning and mix placements before turning to these to add a tiny bit of overall enhancement. So I never use copious amounts of it. Would you have to duplicate the track and turn it into stereo. If you duplicate it, you will get two mono tracks aka dual mono, not true stereo. If you record something with one mic, it will be mono regardless how many times you duplicate it, because there will be only M content in it, and no S content in other words, there will be no difference between left and right channel.

If you want to make such recording stereo, you need to somehow generate this difference between

left and right, which actually is the S component. Plugins like Waves Center do not generate the S component, they just manipulate the preexisting S and M components. Except the TG, I'm embarrassed to say I don't even know what that is!! Haha!! I do find the mono maker handy, and I do find the punch, hi and low controls just as handy. I'm not a fan of making things wider as a rule with these kinds of plugins but that depends on the sound library I'm using. If not done to the extreme there won't be any correlation errors. I didn't have enough time to read the manual and really get in too deep. The Spread feature is WAY more subtle than I expected. I liked the More is More preset. Until I can read the manual this plug is useless to me. If not done to the extreme there won't be any correlation errors. Haha!! Now I'm even more embarrassed, because I have that!! It's funny because I was thinking in the context of stereo widener, so it didn't ring a bell because it was used in a different context. It's funny how our brains work at times. I must admit if never tried the TG in MidSide mode, I have many other tools I use for that role, namely Plugin Alliance and HEQ. I mainly opt to work with reducing the width of stereo sources and pan them counterpoint to another source occupying a similar part of the audio spectrum. The spread is very similar to an MS matrix; it is faithful to the plugin's analog origins, however, in that the encoding and decoding of the matrix do not cancel each other perfectly, giving the spread its distinctive vintage character.
