We know that the appropriate quote is essential when using information from references such as books, periodicals, visual media and online sources. However, many of us forget to mention the images we use in our manuscripts. Images include photographs, paintings, drawings, graphs, diagrams and graphs. Just like other information, we borrowed from a source, the images are also subject to correct quotation. Using the American Psychological Association (APA) quote system, the images are mentioned in the caption and the reference list. Include only the reference information available from the source. Some sources may not have copyright information. Assign figure numbers to images. Corsicize The numbers of figure and the title of books and periodicals. If there is no title, instead provide a brief description of the image. The author's name is written with the initials first followed by the surname. Include copyright information (copyright support and copyright support) and the permission of use. Write the full name of the copyright support. Reference list include only the reference information available from the source. In italics the title or description of the image, as well as the title of books and periodicals. Write n. D. If the date of publication is not available. If there is no title, instead provide a brief description of the image. For images without author, use the image title instead of the author. Include image format (e. G. Photographing, graph, map, painting). List the URL for the images found Web. Caption of the book Basic format: Figure number. Description or title of the image. TitleBook (p. Recovered from There are special requirements for the use of clip art images and stock in APA Style cards. Common sources for stock images and clip art are iStock, Getty Images, Adobe Stock, Shutterstock, Pixabay and Flickr. Common sources for art clips are Microsoft Word and Microsoft PowerPoint. The license associated with clip art or image stock determines how it should be accredited. Sometimes the license does not indicate any reference or attribution is required, in which case writers may The image without any reference, quote, or attribution in a card APA Style. Other times, the license indicates that the credit is necessary to reproduce reproduce in which case writers should write apa style copyright award and a voice in the reference list. follow the license terms associated with the image you want to reproduce. Guidelines apply regardless of whether the image costs or is available for free. Guidelines also apply to students and professionals and both to powerpoint documents and presentations. Although for most images it is necessary to look at the license case by case, images and clip art of programs like microsoft word and microsoft powerpoint can be used without attribution. By purchasing the program, you purchased a license to use the art clip and images that come with the program without attribution. This page contains examples of clip art or stock images, including: image without attribution request image requiring a attribute if the license associated with clip art or a stock image indicates "no required attribution", then do not provide apa style reference, quote in text or copyright attribution. For example, this image of a cat comes from pixabay and has a license that says that the image is free to reproduce it without need of attribution. to use the image as a figure in an apa style sheet, provide a figure number and a title and then the image. if you want, describe the image in a figurative note. in a presentation (like a powerpoint presentation,) the number of the figure, the title and the note are optional. figure 1 a striped cat sits with the crossed legs known. participants assigned to the condition of cute animals saw this image of a cat. if the license associated with clip art or a stock image requires the attribution, provide a copyright allocation in the figure note and a voice in the list of references for the image in the list of references. Many (but not all) images with creative commons licenses require attribution. For example, this image of a sled dog comes from flickr and has a creative commons license (especially cc by 2.0), the license declares that the image is free to oate but attribution is required. to use the image as a figure in an apa style sheet, provide a figure number and a title and then the image. under the image, provide a copyright attribute in the figure note. in a presentation, the number of figures and the title are optional, but the note containing copyright is required. The copyright is oata instead of a quote in the text. The copyright attribute is the same elements as the reference list, but in a different order (title, author, date, site name, url,) followed by the name of the creative commons license. also provide a reference list entry for the image. the entry of the reference listThe image is composed of author, year of publication, title, description in parentheses and source (usually website name and URL). To cite clip art or an archive image without reproducing it, provide a citation in the text for the image instead of a copyright attribution. Note: Images in the text are generally accompanied by a caption that includes copyright information and an authorization statement to use. Please check with your instructor to see if it is necessary.
