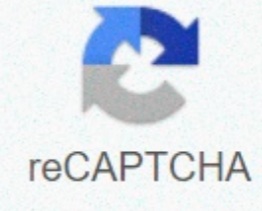

Please try few steps recommended below. 1. Open Device Manager. 2. Expand category "Universal Serial Bus controllers". 3. Double-click the "USB Root Hub" device, and click the Power Management tab. (if there's more than one USB Root Hub device, repeat these steps for each one.) 4. Turn off the Allow the computer to turn off this device to save power option, and click OK button. Disconnect all USB devices connected to the computer except a USB mouse and keyboard (if in use). This includes hubs, thumb drives, printers, and cameras. In Windows, search for and open Device Manager. The Device Manager window opens. Double-click Universal Serial Bus Controllers to expand the list. Right-click the first USB Root Hub in the list, then select Uninstall. Click OK to confirm. Continue uninstalling all USB Root Hubs listed. Close Device Manager and restart the computer. If the USB device that is having problems came with software and it was not previously installed, install the software now, following the manufacturer instructions. Reconnect the USB device that was having problems and test it to see if it works. Open Device Manager (Right Click on Windows Logo and Click Device Manager). Now find and expand Universal Serial Bus controllers. Now right click on USB drivers and click Uninstall. Do for all USB drivers one by one. Now Restart your PC. The USB drivers are automatically re-install and solve the corrupted USB devices. Right-click on the battery icon and click Power Options. Click Change plan settings. Now click Change advanced power settings. Find and expand USB settings. My USB ports have stopped working completely. I tried to uninstall, reboot, reinstall, but Windows cannot reinstall the drivers itself. I get a code 19 for each of them. "Windows cannot start this hardware device because its information of configuration (in the registry) is incomplete or damaged. (Code 19) » I did not anything out of the ordinary except for an update of the computer, but I tried the system restore and it still does not fix my problem. I suggested either a new reinstall of Windows or to "press F11 on startup to restore my computer to factory settings. I tried deactivating and reactivating. That did not work. The only thing I have not tried also the factory reset setting is reinstall my chipset, but I don't know how or what chipset I have, I just know it's AMD and ATI. My computer is a HP Compaq Presario CQ61-420US with 3 GB of RAM, AMD Athlon II Dual Core processor, I have Windows 7 Home Premium 64-bit. I have tried everything that I could, even went in safe mode, re-install and re-install my drivers, but it didn't work. I really need to get this problem solved, I really need my USB ports and I don't know what to do. Try the following: Start by creating a System Restore Point. Double click on the UpperFilters and remove usfilter > OK Then, restart the computer. USB 1.x devices will cause the USB HUB at the bottom shift to 1.x speeds. You have an old PC (2002), it is possible that your PC does not have a USB HUB 2.0. In this case, you need to install a USB PCI adapter card. Compatible mouse HID installed incorrectly as an USB host controller I'm having a problem with Win7-64 install my mouse (HID-compliant generic) as a USB host controller and then turns off because it does not properly (surprise!). There is no support for my mouse Web site because it is a speciality vertical ergonomic mouse (zero Tension mouse is the name of it). There is no disk to install the software to. I tried to look generic HID-compliant mouse drivers to see if there a software installation package, but not luck. Everything points to a black hole, called Logitech. Under Win7-32, the device installs and runs correctly as a generic HID-compliant mouse, but when I move to my Win 7 64 box, it doesn't work. I tried to go through and uninstall the driver and reinstall using the generic drivers in the driver sys32 directory, but it won't let me do that. Win7-64 insists that the device is a USB controller, when it clearly isn't. I also tried to use the legacy device installation procedure, but no luck as Windows gives me any options even at a distance that may be regarded as 'mouse'. Maybe, I'll dive into the registry and try to coax Win7-64 in the light like a mouse. \* sigh \* I know... do not go, I could really spoil things! I promise you that I'll just search. Hi Catroast, My apologies for asking redundant questions. The operating system uses the information stored in the firmware on the mouse to identify itself. This process can be damaged by an anti-virus that is confounding the install as an attack and prevent the correct information transfer. You can try to install the mouse with the anti-virus temporarily disabled to see if it affects the issue: Change the ranking or the type of device a piece of hardware is identified as it is a matter of updating the driver. Of course, the necessary driver is selected according to the firmware of the mouse. I think the issue here is the 64 bit version of Windows. It is possible that the chipset drivers which are installed may need to be updated. They are the other component of the hardware identification system. The chipset drivers are for on-board devices from the motherboard (USB, PCI, sound card) if embedded and can sometimes be outdated or corrupt. This can cause the material to be misidentified as well. I recommend that you check the site of PC manufacturers to see if the drivers have an available update. One last suggest would be to see if a BIOS firmware is also available from the manufacturer of the PC. It helps in the process of installing equipment, working in tandem with the chipset drivers and BIOS settings. I see that the site recommends Windows 98 to XP for operating system compatibility. It is possible that they have not updated the device drivers for the 64-bit platform. Honestly, I'm surprised, he worked on the Win7 32 bit PC, but it uses the generic driver in this case. A 64-bit driver is probably much more specific to the device, and therefore a generic driver will not be not available. I downloaded the latest drivers from Intel's WIDi: & DwnldID = 22016 & Prodlid = 3227 & lang = eng These seem to be more recent than those provided by HP. I have installed all drivers you first (display, chipset, etc.), then I installed the WIDi software (link above). The USB - if USB Host Controller xHCI has been recognized very well.
